







The historic Stillwater Armory was constructed in 1922 in response to World War I and was used over the decades, not just for military training but also for public events, sports and concerts. It remained in sporadic use by the National Guard throughout World War II, Korea, Vietnam, the Iraq Wars and Afghanistan and served as the fieldhouse headquarters for the National Guard's 34th Military Police Company, during both peacetime and war. After the building was vacated by the National Guard, it came under new ownership and is currently undergoing historic preservation and redevelopment into a potential mixed use space for multiple commercial uses, including an incredible once-in-a-lifetime space in the celebrated gymnasium of the Fieldhouse34.



LOCATION: At the top of the hill on Chestnut Street in historic Stillwater within walking distance to abundant main street restaurants, breweries, retailers and local business as well as stunning views of the St. Croix river and iconic lift bridge



AVAILABILITY: Build-to-suit and potential for multiple commercial uses
